Describe your experience in the early childhood education and care sector.

I have been actively involved in the ECEC sector since the early 1990s when my parents acquired their first service. My mother played a significant role in emphasising the importance of high-quality ECEC for all children, especially those with additional needs. I transitioned to full-time work in the sector in 2001 and successfully launched my first service in 2006. Over the years, I have managed 4 other ECEC services and held various key roles. Currently, I operate two services in the northwestern suburbs of Melbourne.

Tell us what makes ACA Victoria's mission meaningful to you.

In my 15 years with ACA Victoria, I have strived to ensure the success of our members and assist them in delivering high-quality ECEC provision. Without strong and viable providers, outcomes for children will be compromised, and it is our shared success that will ensure our sector delivers on the growing awareness of the benefits of accessing ECEC in the broader community.

Describe any Board Leadership experience you have had to date.

I have been involved on the ACA Victoria board since 2009 and have filled all roles on the board. I currently serve as ACA National President, having held that position for eight years. I am also the chair of my children's School Advisory Council.

I have had the good fortune of building significant connections to suppliers and partners in my role at ACA Vic and National. These relationships continue to deliver strong financial resources for ACA and the state branches. Many of these partners deliver significant member benefits.
